FARMYARD TAILS

Hello, my name is Tracey and together with my husband John we farm on the North side of Claypole.

I thought I would try my hand at telling you a few things about what happens month by month on our livestock farm.

We relocated to Claypole from the Peak district just over a year ago now.

It took us just over 8 months to bring everything over here with the animals being the last to arrive.

The cattle alone took 22 trailer journeys as they travelled over in singles or with their calves. The younger stock travelled in two's for company.

At the moment we have 63 Pedigree Highlands ranging from 17yrs old down to little 'Dennis' who is 2mths old.

We have 50 sheep of various breeds, a cat called 'Pips' and a bundle of assorted hens.

The older cows (those over 3yrs old) are running with our bull 'Ragnor', they have their calves with them until they are about 8 or 9 months old. This length of time gives the calf a good start in life and prevents the cow getting fat from eating the lush summer grass.

We will need to pregnancy scan the cows soon to see if they are back in calf. The gestation of a calf is like us, 9 months.

Summer on the whole was a challenge with the intermittent rain but we

managed to get all the hay in the barn and at the beginning of September we baled the straw which we use for winter bedding when the cows all come inside due to the fields being too wet for them to walk on.

I will pop a few lines in the newsletter every month with a photo or two. I hope you find it of interest? See you soon, Tracey

Halloween Is at the end of this month, so if you are going to carve out a pumpkin, why not save the flesh & make these?

Halloween Pumpkin Cupcakes

(All weights & measures are approximate)

200g/7 & half oz grated Pumpkin (butternut squash can be used instead) 200g/7 & half oz Self-raising Flour 1tsp Bicarbonate of Soda (bicarb)

175g/6oz Muscovado Sugar or if preferred, light brown sugar 175ml/5-6 fluid oz Sunflower Oil or which ever oil you prefer

3 Large Eggs

2tsp Mixed Spice

1tsp Vanilla Extract

Grated Zest of 1 orange or lemon if preferred

100g/3-4 oz Sultanas

Frosting

Tub full fat cream cheese Icing Sugar Small Halloween cake topper decorations

Method

- 1. Heat the oven to 180c/160c fan & line a 12 hole muffin tin with paper cases.
- 2. Pour oil into a large bowl & add sugar, eggs & essence. Beat it all together.
- 3. Add grated pumpkin, zest & sultanas.
- 4. Stir in flour, bicarb & spice.
- 5. Spoon mixture into cases & bake for 25 mins until springy to touch & a skewer inserted comes out clean.
- 6. Cool & when col, they can be frozen at this stage.
- 7. Beat the cream cheese & icing sugar together & spread on top of cupcakes & decorate.

A compost bin is a cost-effective and economical way to help materials decompose into compost, becoming fertiliser for your plants. A must have for any gardener!

It also helps lower your carbon footprint!

Did you know that across an average day in Britain, 158 million tea bags are used and then discarded? It is not news that we, as a nation, love to drink tea -but what if I told you that very same love could help the environment?

Tea bags are one example of the many materials that can be placed inside your compost bin, helping to reduce emissions from greenhouse gases and improve soil health. As any gardener would know, improved soil health equals more resilient growth in plants. Therefore, as well as helping the environment, you are also improving your own gardens!

Compost bins also help reduce waste around the home. How often have you peeled vegetables for dinner and had to throw away said peelings? Or brewed a coffee and ended up being left with the grounds, unsure of how to dispose of them?

You can dispose of both of these in your compost bin!

However, there are some materials that cannot be put in your compost bin and need to be avoided. Such as, meat, fat or dairy. Another example would be synthetic materials, like rubber or plastic. Chemicals from the plastic can end up leaking into the compost and damaging the soil, which has no benefits for your plants or us if being used on plants carrying fruits and vegetables.

Remember to check before you dispose!

Wetherill's Bakery / Evan's Store

I've written over 60 articles for the Parish Mag since 2018!! The very first one was about Les and Dorothy Wetherill who lived in Seaton Cottages and included images of Les's Garage and his father / grand fathers Bakery on Main Street. We thought it was time for a revisit. The Bakery is now a family home.



Noted Tea, Bread, and Cakes.

CLAYPOLE, NEWARK.

Les's parents and grandparents owned the village store and the image of 1911 shows the frontage and the carts used for delivering groceries to the surrounding villages. The shop had eleven employees, so was a substantial employer and enterprise.

Villagers making their own pork pies and Christmas cakes were able to take them to the bakery to cook them using the remaining heat from the ovens. The current village store at that time was a butchers, so the pie contents didn't have far too go.

The store was sold to Mr Flemming. His daughter Sue was active in the Claypole Young Farmers which had a fantastic social calendar. Sue later emigrated to Canada and three years later her parents sold the store and joined her there. The premises were bought by Mr Austen Evans, whose family still live in Claypole, in 1961.



The ovens were taken out and the premises became a supermarket until 1980. The shop was converted to homes in the early 2010s and the land at the rear was developed and named Evans Close.

Les is still alive and now lives in Navenby near his daughter.

There was also a Wetherill's shop/bakery in Fulbeck with a similar history.


